

## The Other Side of the Tapestry

Literary Contest on Writing, Reading and Misunderstanding

The Contest will start on November 4, 2019

## Rules

The competition will be between groups of students (from the same class, or from different classes; maximum of 4 students per group). Applications must be submitted by email to the library, <a href="mailto:bibliotecastein@gmail.com">bibliotecastein@gmail.com</a> no later than Thursday, October 31. The application must include:

Class and Course - Team Name - List of Participants - Name and Email Address (gmail) of Team Captain

## First Part of the Competition

On November 4 participants will find on the school web site, and on the library commons board, the first clue (find a book) of the Treasure Hunting inside the school library.

Upon team's arrival in the school library, instructions will be given by the librarian about how books are ordered in the library (CDD System). Teams will have to find the book and discover that inside there is a small sheet with an English/Italian text referring to another famous novel.

As soon as teams find the book and retrieve the sheet, they have to **read it very carefully;** soon afterwards Team Captains are requested to email the Library address <a href="mailto:bibliotecastein@gmail.com">bibliotecastein@gmail.com</a> with:

- 1. Author and Title of the book retrieved in the Treasure Hunting
- 2. Author and Title of the book the text in the sheet is taken from
- 3. The error in translation concealed inside the Italian text

**On November 8 and 12** participants will find, respectively, the second and the third clue of the Treasure Hunting, inside the **contest shared drive folder** and on the library commons board.

Library opening hours for the hunting: every day from 9 a.m. except Wednesday (9 a.m. - 11 a.m.) and Saturday.

On November 15, teams will find the last big question inside the contest shared drive folder and on the Library commons board. Final answers are expected by November 18.

<u>In summary we expect: identification of three books, titles and authors of three novels, three</u> mistakes (or misunderstandings) plus the answer to the last question.
